Background and Liturgical use: This is a setting of the ever popular passage from 1 Corinthians 12:31-13:13, most often heard at wedding celebrations. This reading is also one of the appointed scriptures for the Fourth Sunday in Ordinary Time (Year C). In this passage, Paul concentrates on the gift of love, the greatest of all the spiritual gifts, and an opportunity for all. Self sacrifice and service of others is the greatest manifestation of that love, and this kind of love will never cease to be our greatest calling as believers.

Performance: Important attentiveness to the contrast between the verses and refrain is most important, not only in terms of the meter shift, but in terms of contrast in texture and in the communication of the text. The refrain in a sense is the "teacher" or "catechist," clarifying the challenges and self-examination of the verses. The verses are best when sung by a soloist, and it is important to emphasize the harmonic texture and deliberate dissonance and resolutions of the SATB parts on the refrain. The instrumental accompaniment should be very simple, not utilizing too many instruments.
